Students should have completed these books prior to competition. This book is published electronically and you should have no problem printing out pages for your teachers. Please be sure this info is used in preparation of your in-house contests in January. Please note that rating sheets are included for those contests that have standard rating sheets developed for each state contest.

RULES:

2. Each contestant will have 1 hour to plan, print and prepare the presentation, storybook, and visual aid for transitional activities.
