The CE: Foundations is free with professional membership and the CE: Experiences may have an additional cost. Students should complete these programs prior to participating in a competitive event. This book is published electronically and you should have no problem printing out pages for your teachers. Please be sure this info is used in preparation of your in-house contests in January. Please note that rating sheets are included for those contests that have standard rating sheets developed for each state contest.
